# 2019 Washington City Management Report

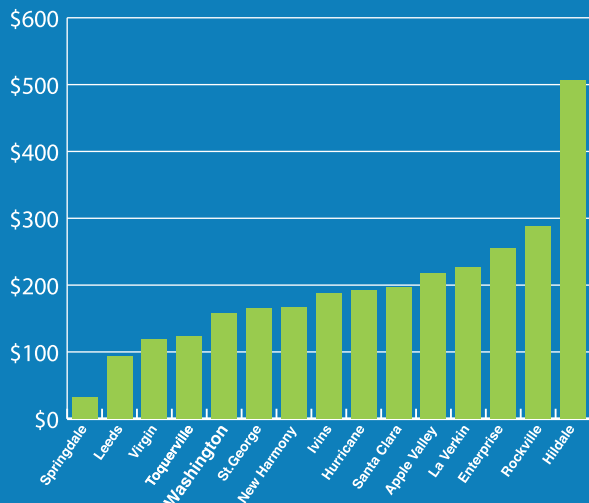
Dear Resident,

Property Taxed Assessed on \$250,000 Home



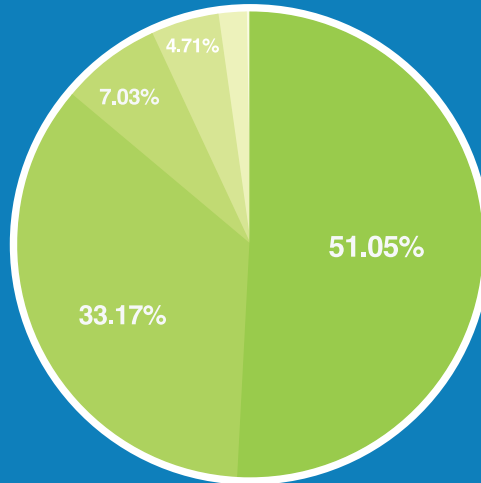

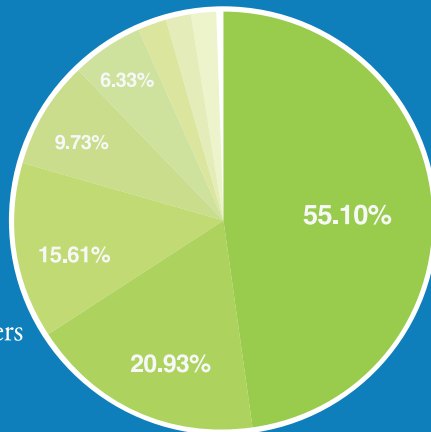
